



# Classmate Feature: My South Korea Missionary Experience by Still Dewey


After living in Alaska for 20 years, I retired then moved to Missouri, just outside Branson. My wife Janene and I decided that we wanted to do something positive with our time so we valunteered to be missionaries for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. We were assigned to South Korea and left on September 6, 2019. After a long flight and concerns of a typhoan, we were welcomed by a huge crowd. However, the excitement wasn't just for us, as it turned out it was an important Korea holiday and many family members were returning home but we were just glad to get settled and able to sleep in a real bed.

Our job was to handle the affice affairs so the young missionaries could be out visiting with the Karean people. I managed all the finances while Janene made sure that around 100 missionaries followed Karean immigration law. On Wednesday evenings we taught an English class. We usually had 6-8 mostly alder students. They were kind enough to give us rides to stores to gracery shop and even took us to Costco. Young Kareans are required to study English in school every grade, including college. Americans are very welcome in South Karea. They know that the only reason that they aren't communist is because of us. It is a very safe place to be. We never felt in any danger.

We walked about a half mile to the office every day. There were walls by the park we passed, but we never saw any graffiti anywhere. The place was kept very clean. Most people dressed very stylishly. When we were out, we would say "hi" to people we passed. That was one of the few Korean phrases we knew. About once a month we would see another Westerner.

We made good friends. One gentleman from our English class wants to come to the U.S. and drive to Alasko with me. They have a small country and can't fatham being able to drive that far. I'm looking farward to that. They were impressed when I showed them pictures of us holding salman we caught. They are big on seafood so that was a hit.

We planned to visit tourist attractions when three of our children visited this summer. Unfortunately, in early March the problems with COVID-19 were very prominent in Karea. We self-isolated for a couple of weeks before getting the word that we were being sent home. It was sad to say goodbye to the wonderful people that we had grown to love and respect. When this virus is finally contained, we are hoping to go right back to South Korea.



# April 22, 1970: Earth Day (From Skuhkum Views May 9, 1970)

Whether or not you called it Earth Day or Environmental Day, the occasion was never the less acknowledged on April 22, 1970, during Environmental Week.

Arm Bands were warn in recognition of the day, with the initials "L. A. W." representing the anti-pollution slagan "Land-Air-Water". Several social studies teachers presented special environment films depicting pollution as it is, was, and might be in the near future. One teacher took his class on a short walk to the school trash dump and followed with an ecological discussion. Others in the school walked or rade bicycles instead of traveling in cars and busses, which are a major contributor to our polluted atmosphere.

In other places marches, speeches, rallies, and demonstrations (mostly non-violent) were held, brought about by dislike of our pollution filled skies. At Wilson High School in Tacoma, there was a mack burial of Mather Earth, using an old discarded glave. At the University of Washington several students read pertinent passages from the Christian bible, listened to speeches and saw a day of special ecologic films.

The purpose of this event was to bring more recognition to the ever-growing problem of pollution. The solving of the confronting crisis will be key to mankind's future on Earth.

# Website Highlight: Robert Broussard

The website has many features. A new addition to individual biographical information is noting U.S. Armed Forces (active and veterans) service of students in our class and S.K.H.S. Featured here is Robert Broussard, a classmate who enlisted right out of high school. When asked if he served in Vietnam, Bob shared the following.

"I wanted to go to Vietnam but by the time I was done with all my training, they weren't sending my types over there anymore. I was a "SEER" instructor at the infamous "Tigerland" at Fort Polk, Louisiana. The Rangers had a full-scale Vietcong POW Camp that we ran and trained new soldiers. "SEER" is, Search, Escape, Evade, Resist. There was a saying about the Rangers during Vietnam... they are everywhere, you just can't see them. That was my job... teaching new Recruits to be invisible. Not a glamorous job, but one that was necessary.

I mentioned in my webpage bio that my military experience changed me. What I meant about it changing me was the fact that even today, when I go into a restaurant or a crowded room, I always position myself to watch the entrance... and, when I would go into the woods for a hike, I always examine the terrain to see what I have to do to "blend in"...but, the most important change it made that I have never been able to shake is just the fact that what we were taught to do as Rangers... to be able to perform a certain function against someone else quickly and efficiently without thinking about it, dulled my senses towards people it seems... lack of compassion at times, not caring at times and so on was an unhealthy by-product of the job. You are brainwashed thoroughly to believe that this is necessary and is only part of the mission... this is how I am today."
